About the Artist

Krista Seddon is a pianist, composer, and lecture performance artist. Currently, she is working on Season III of the Katharine Pratt Horton Salon Concert Series for the KPH Buffalo Chapter, NSDAR: Marian McPartland & Friends: a centennial celebration of a life in music. In Season I, Krista took her audiences on a journey into the lives and work of some of the world's most fascinating composers to explore the connections between classical music and jazz. Season II explored the power of music to articulate our emotions and our shared human experience. Season III is dedicated to an artist who defied convention, abandoned her classical career path, and followed her heart into the world of jazz. The 2018-2019 season is her story.

As the world posthumously celebrates Marian McPartland's 100th birthday, we will be treated to her story and the music that made her a household name around the globe.
